Petition for Declaratory Ruling to be Added to the Permitted List

Space Communications Corporation, a Japanese corporation, has filed a Petition for a Declaratory Ruling pursuant to Section 25.137 of the Commission's Rules and the DISCO II First Reconsideration Order to add its Superbird-C satellite, which is licensed by Japan, operating in the 14.0-14.5 GHz (uplink) and 11.7-12.2 GHz (downlink) frequency bands, at 143.95° E.L. to the Commission's Permitted Space Station List.
