Special Temporary Authority

EchoStar Satellite Operating Corporation has filed an application for special temporary authority to permit it to test its new EchoStar 10 spacecraft at 138.5° W.L. for a period of up to 90 days following launch. EchoStar 10 is a Direct Broadcast Satellite satellite that EchoStar proposes to operate at the 110° W.L. orbital location. (See File No. SAT-LOA-20051221-00267.) EchoStar states that temporary operation of EchoStar 10 at 138.5° W.L. will permit testing to occur without disruption to existing customers at 110° W.L. and will not adversely affect the operation of any other carrier's spacecraft or other authorized spectrum users. EchoStar 10 is tentatively scheduled to launch in early February 2006.
