## **COMMISSIONER COPPS ANNOUNCES STAFF CHANGES**

Commissioner Michael J. Copps announced today that John Giusti, his Acting Legal Advisor for wireless and international issues, will be leaving his staff to serve as Deputy Bureau Chief of the International Bureau. Commissioner Copps expressed his deep appreciation for John: "I thank John for his wise counsel and advice on wireless and international issues. He will be missed by my office, and by me personally, but we look forward to working with him in his new capacity. John's intelligence, diplomatic skill and good judgment will be a great asset to the International Bureau.
