## STATEMENT OF COMMISSIONER DEBORAH TAYLOR TATE

Re: Third Periodic Review of the Commission's Rules and Policies Affecting the Conversion to Digital Television, Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (MB Docket No. 07-91)

With this *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking*, we begin our third periodic review of the digital television ("DTV") transition. We all have a role to play in order to make the transition a smooth one and realize the benefits that it promises, freeing up spectrum for incredible new applications and services, including the deployment of broadband across rural areas of this country. I applaud the Digital TV Transition Coalition comprised of business, trade, industry and grassroots organizations for their commitment to help educate and inform consumers regarding this exciting move to a dazzling truly digital world.
