TAMPA MEDIA OWNERSHIP FIELD HEARING STATEMENT OF COMMISSIONER DEBORAH TAYLOR TATE

I welcome the opportunity to hear from the citizens of the Tampa-St. Petersburg, Florida area – a thriving technology center, the largest media market in the state, and 12th largest television DMA in the United States.
