FCC RELEASES UPDATED AGENDA FOR DECEMBER 4, 2007 DIGITAL TELEVISION CONSUMER EDUCATION WORKSHOP FOCUSING ON MINORITY AND NON-ENGLISH-SPEAKING COMMUNITIES

Washington, DC -- The Commission has released an updated agenda for its Digital Television Consumer Education Workshop focusing on minority and non-English-speaking communities to be held Tuesday, December 4, 2007, at FCC Headquarters, 445 12th St., S.W., Washington, DC, in the Commission Meeting Room. It will begin at 9:00 a.m. and end at 12:15 p.m.

The purpose of the Workshop is to provide an opportunity for interested parties to discuss the challenges associated with ensuring that minority communities and non-English-speakers receive and can act on information regarding the upcoming transition and to explore ways to develop coordinated consumer education activities.
