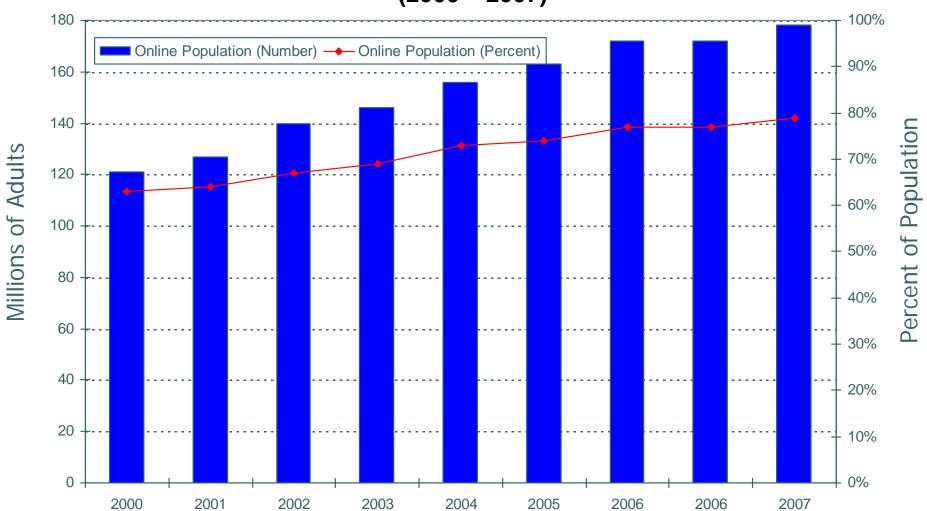

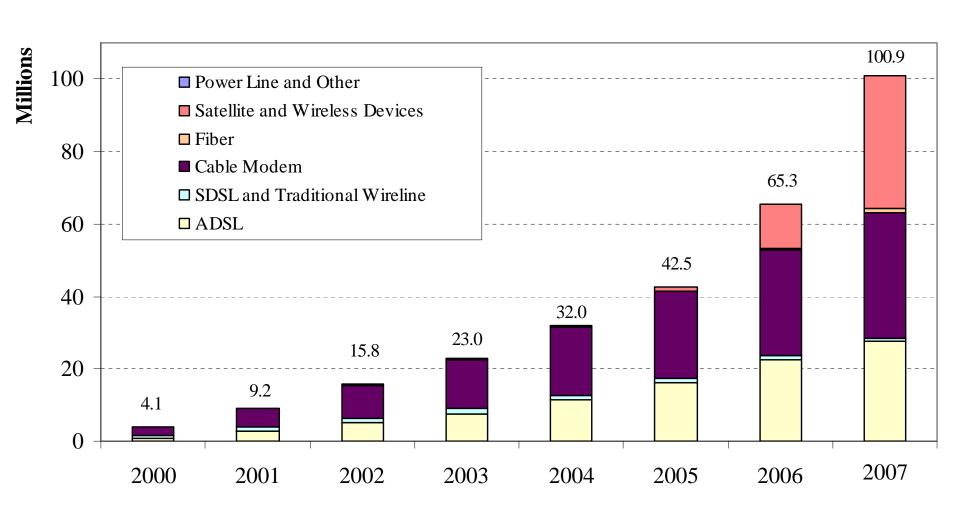
### US Online Population (2000 – 2007)



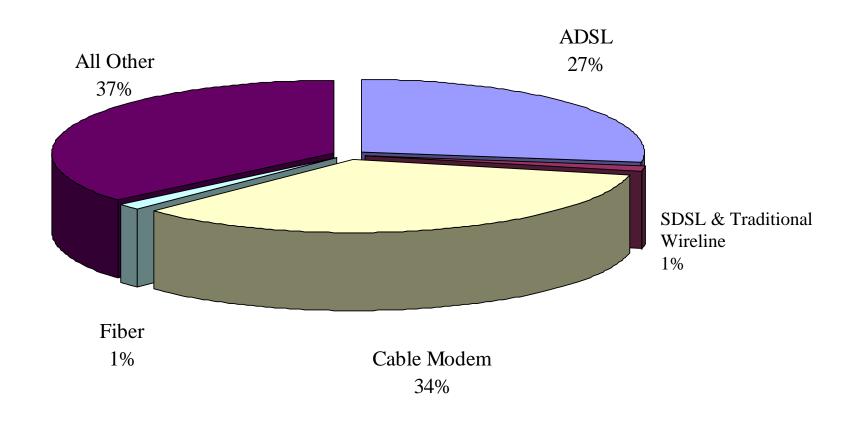

### High Speed Line Growth (2000 – 2007)\*

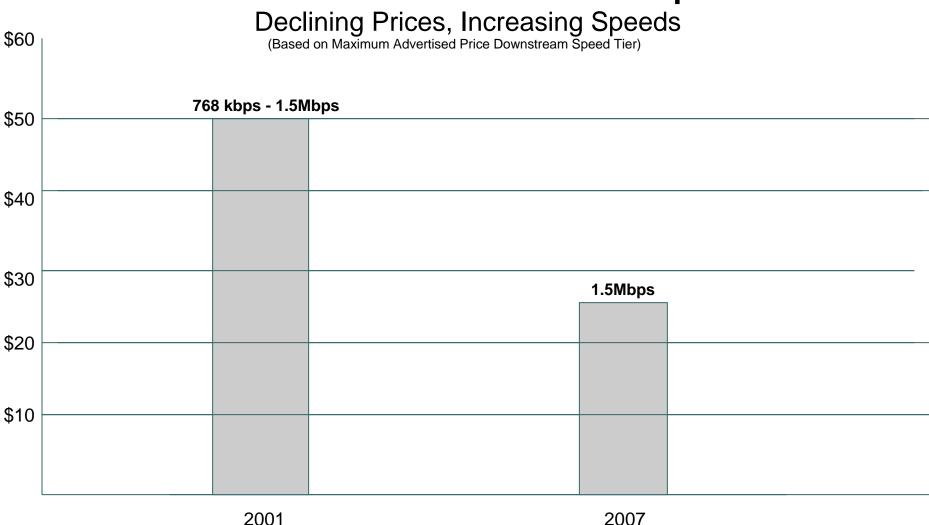


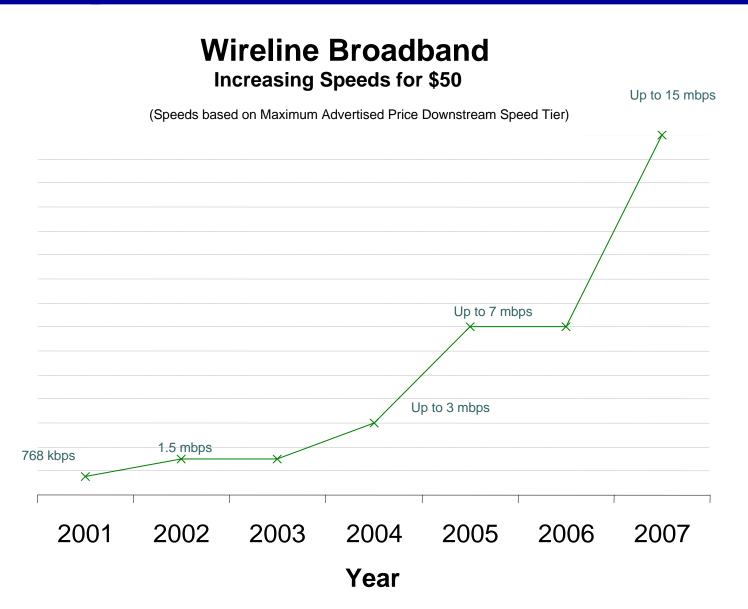
#### High-Speed Lines in the US by Technology as of June 30, 2007



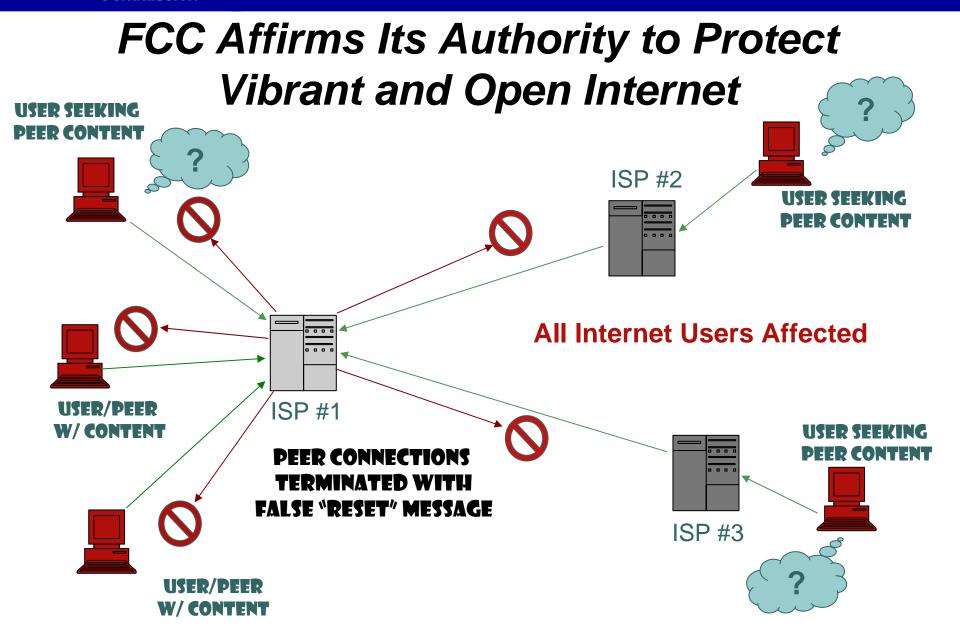


#### Wireline Broadband Prices and Speeds

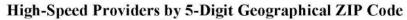


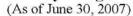


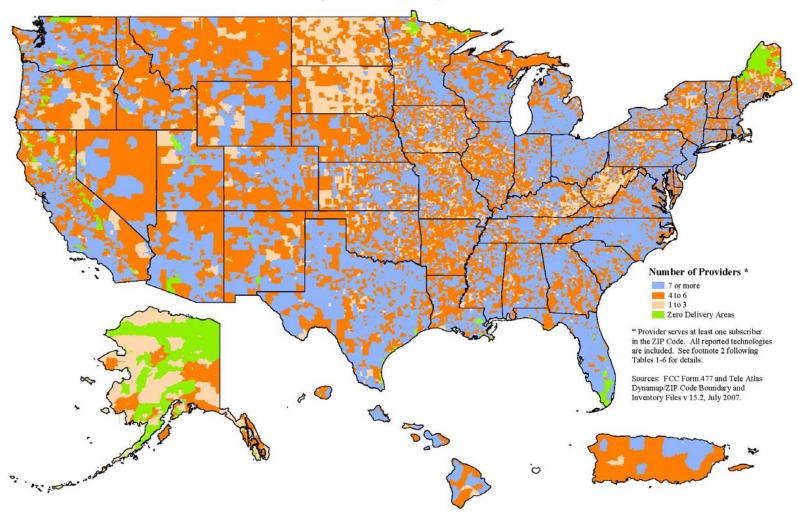

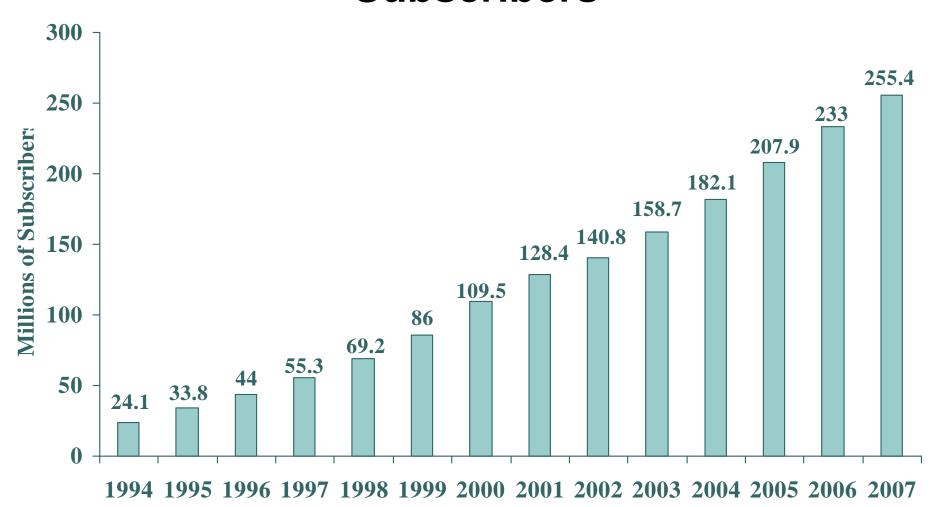

#### 700 MHz Band and the DTV Transition

- O 700 MHz band -- critical to development of an alternative broadband platform for:
  - Public Safety
  - Commercial Wireless Services
- Open Platform for 1/3 of the band consumers may use the wireless device of their choice
- 10 MHz block ("D Block") for the creation of a national public safety network
  - No bid met reserve price
  - FCC seeking comment on rules governing the public/private partnership to achieve public safety network goal
