**COMMISSIONER ADELSTEIN TO VISIT ALBUQUERQUE FOR DTV OUTREACH**  
*Visit is Part of Extensive Nationwide Tour Focusing on Markets with High Levels of Over-the-Air Television Viewers*

*Washington, DC* – FCC Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein announced that he will visit Albuquerque, New Mexico on April 22 and 23, 2009. During his visit, Commissioner Adelstein will hold two public town hall meetings on the digital television (DTV) transition.
