MIGNON CLYBURN SWORN IN AS FCC COMMISSIONER AT CEREMONY IN SOUTH CAROLINA

Columbia, SC – Senior District Judge Matthew J. Perry, Jr. of the U.S. District Court for the District of South Carolina administered the oath of office today to Mignon L.
