**NOTICE OF UNLICENSED OPERATION**

The San Francisco Office received information that an unlicensed broadcast radio station on 107.3 MHz was allegedly operating in San Francisco, CA. On August 17, 2009 agents from this office confirmed by direction finding techniques that radio signals on frequency 107.3 MHz were emanating from the property at 3011 23<sup>rd</sup> Street, San Francisco, CA. Public records list you as the owners of the property. The Commission's records show that no license was issued for operation of a broadcast station at this location on 107.3 MHz in San Francisco, CA.

Radio stations must be licensed by the FCC pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 301. The only exception to this licensing requirement is for certain transmitters using or operating at a power level that complies with the standards established in Part 15 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 15.1 *et seq.* The operation on frequency 107.3 MHz was measured at 63,034 microvolt's per meter ( $\mu\text{V}/\text{m}$ ) at 3 meters. This exceeds the allowable unlicensed limit of 250  $\mu\text{V}/\text{m}$  at 3 meters established in Part 15. Thus, this station is operating in violation of 47 U.S.C. § 301.

You are hereby warned that operation of radio transmitting equipment without a valid radio station authorization constitutes a violation of the Federal laws cited above and could subject the operator of this illegal operation to severe penalties, including, but not limited to, substantial monetary forfeitures, *in rem* arrest action against the offending radio equipment, and criminal sanctions including imprisonment. (See 47 U.S.C. §§ 401, 501, 503 and 510.)

**UNLICENSED OPERATION OF THIS RADIO STATION MUST BE DISCONTINUED IMMEDIATELY.**

You have ten (10) days from the date of this notice to respond with any evidence that you have authority to operate granted by the FCC. Your response should be sent to the address in the letterhead and reference the listed case and document number. Under the Privacy Act of 1974, 5 U.S.C. § 552a(e)(3), we are informing you that the Commission's staff will use all relevant material information before it to determine what, if any, enforcement action is required to ensure your compliance with FCC Rules. This will include any information that you disclose in your reply.
