NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Released: August 9, 2010

By the District Director, Northeast Region, Philadelphia Office, Enforcement Bureau:

- This is a Notice of Violation ("Notice") issued pursuant to Section 1.89 of the Commission's Rules¹ to Scott Sheppard, owner of the vessel Cookie Monster in Port Norris, New Jersey.
- 2. On May 17, 2010, in response to an interference complaint from the United States Mission Control Center, agents of the Commission's Philadelphia Office used direction finding techniques to locate the source of interference on the frequency 406.025 MHz to the vessel Cookie Monster, docked on the Maurice River in Port Norris, New Jersey. The agents inspected the EPIRB aboard the vessel and observed the following violation:

47 C.F.R. § 80.89(a): "Stations must not engage in superfluous radiocommunication." Transmissions by emergency position indicating radio beacons ("EPIRBs") are intended to be actuated manually or automatically and operated automatically as part of a ship or a survival craft station as a locating aid for survival purposes. The agents found the Satellite 406 EPIRB activated aboard the Cookie Monster in the absence of any actual emergency situation and the device was transmitting a beacon signal on the frequency 406.025 MHz.

3. Pursuant to Sections 308(b) and 403 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended,² and Section 1.89 of the Commission's Rules, Scott Sheppard must submit a written statement concerning this matter within twenty (20) days of release of this Notice. The response must fully explain each violation, must contain a statement of the specific action(s) taken to correct each violation and preclude recurrence, and should include a time line for completion of pending corrective action(s). The response must be complete in itself and signed by Scott Sheppard. All replies and documentation sent in response to this Notice should be marked with the File No. and NOV No. specified above, and mailed to the following address:

Any false statement made knowingly and willfully in reply to this Notice is punishable by fine or imprisonment under Title 18 of the U.S. Code.⁴
