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
Dear Chairman Genachowski:

It is my understanding that a draft order relating to the proposed merger of Comcast-NBC Universal has been circulated. It would appear that the draft order takes into consideration voluminous filings and comments from both proponents and opponents of the merger. Further, reports indicate that extensive conditions have been attached to any contemplated approval and that the applicants have agreed to abide by those requirements.

I believe that the FCC has had a sufficient amount of time to make its final decision. All information necessary to make the proper analysis appears to have been submitted and any concerns that members of the Commission have raised have been addressed by the aforementioned conditions. While not privy to the applicants' business arrangements to facilitate the merger, I must assume that an unreasonable delay in securing a ruling from the FCC introduces such uncertainty as to impact the viability of existing agreements among the parties and other stakeholders.

The duty of any governmental regulatory agency is to act thoroughly, fairly and expeditiously. At this point, further delaying a vote on the merger does not work to benefit anybody. I appreciate the FCC's diligence and dedication but ask that you now move forward in rendering your decision.
