Dear Congressman Markey:

Thank you for your letter providing guidance on Congressional intent for Section 202(b) of the 21st Century Communications and Video Accessibility Act of 2010 (CVAA). The Commission found this guidance valuable in establishing its rules implementing the CVAA, and I appreciate your continued leadership on this very important issue.

In its January 12th *Report and Order*, the Commission determined that when substantially all of a televised full-length program is posted online, even when posted in multiple segments, it must be captioned. The Commission opted not to limit the definition of video clips to particular types of segments like promotional announcements. Instead, the *Order* encourages programmers and distributors to provide captioning for IP-delivered video clips wherever they are able to do so. Further, the *Order* leaves open the prospect of reexamining the matter of video clips if the Commission finds that deaf and hard of hearing consumers are not getting access to critical areas of programming, particularly news.

I look forward to continuing our work making telecommunications services accessible to all segments of society. Please let me know if you have any additional questions or concerns.
