**NOTICE OF VIOLATION**

**Released: September 13, 2012**

By the Resident Agent, Portland Resident Agent Office, Western Region, Enforcement Bureau:

1. This is a Notice of Violation (Notice) issued pursuant to Section 1.89 of the Commission's Rules,<sup>1</sup> to FM Idaho Co., LLC (FM Idaho), licensee of radio station KINF in Boise, Idaho. Pursuant to Section 1.89(a) of the Commission's Rules, issuance of this NOV does not preclude the Enforcement Bureau from further action if warranted, including issuing a Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture for the violation noted herein.<sup>2</sup>

2. On August 16, 2012, an agent of the Enforcement Bureau's Portland Office inspected radio station KINF located at 5660 East Franklin Road, Nampa, Idaho, and observed the following violation:

- a. 47 C.F.R. § 11.15: “[The Emergency Alert System (EAS)] Operating Handbook states in summary form the actions to be taken by personnel at EAS Participant facilities upon receipt of an EAN, an EAT, tests, or State and Local Area alerts. It is issued by the FCC and contains instructions for the above situations. A copy of the Handbook must be located at normal duty positions or EAS equipment locations when an operator is required to be on duty and be immediately available to staff responsible for authenticating messages and initiating actions.” At the time of the inspection, KINF did not have the EAS Operating Handbook at the normal duty positions or EAS equipment locations.

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3. As the nation's emergency warning system, the Emergency Alert System is critical to public safety, and we recognize the vital role that broadcasters play in ensuring its success. The Commission takes seriously any violations of the Rules implementing the EAS and expects full compliance from its regulatees.

4. Pursuant to Section 308(b) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended,<sup>3</sup> and Section 1.89 of the Commission's Rules, we seek additional information concerning the violations and any remedial actions taken. Therefore, FM Idaho, must submit a written statement concerning this matter within twenty (20) days of release of this Notice. The response (i) must fully explain each violation, including all relevant surrounding facts and circumstances, (ii) must contain a statement of the specific action(s) taken to correct each violation and preclude recurrence, and (iii) must include a time line for completion of any pending corrective action(s). The response must be complete in itself and must not be abbreviated by reference to other communications or answers to other notices.<sup>4</sup>

5. In accordance with Section 1.16 of the Commission's Rules, we direct FM Idaho to support its response to this Notice with an affidavit or declaration under penalty of perjury, signed and dated by an authorized officer of FM Idaho with personal knowledge of the representations provided in FM Idaho's response, verifying the truth and accuracy of the information therein,<sup>5</sup> and confirming that all of the information requested by this Notice which is in the licensee's possession, custody, control, or knowledge has been produced. To knowingly and willfully make any false statement or conceal any material fact in reply to this Notice is punishable by fine or imprisonment under Title 18 of the U.S. Code.<sup>6</sup>
