## FCC ANNOUNCES OCTOBER 3 WEBINAR ON LOW POWER FM RADIO

Washington, D.C: The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) today announced it will hold its second webinar to answer questions about low power FM (LPFM) and the process for applying for a new LPFM license during the October 15 - October 29, 2013, open filing window. The LPFM service was established in 2000 to create opportunities for new voices to be heard on the radio.

The webinar will be held Thursday, October 3, 2013, from 1:00 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. EST. The session primarily will be a question and answer period where potential applicants can ask Media Bureau staff their specific questions on areas such as the LPFM Channel Finder, creating a CDBS account, filling out the application (Form 318), and any other issues related to the LPFM window and Form 318.
