Dear Mr. Hardy:

This letter is in response to your written inquiry of September 15, 1989, requesting written confirmation of a telephone conversation you had with staff attorney Robert Somers on September 15, 1989. Your inquiry was a follows:

Question: Can a non-commercial radio station broadcast old time radio programs i.e., Jack Benny, Fibber McGee, The Shadow, etc., including the old commercials of the original broadcast of the program(s) (except cigarette commercials)?

Section 3998 of the Communications Act (47 U.S.C. §399b) prohibits noncommercial stations from broadcasting advertisements which are defined as
"...any message or other programming material which is broadcast or otherwise
transmitted in exchange for any remuneration, and which is intended ...to
promote any service, facility, or product offered by any person who is engaged
in such offers for profit..." This statutory provision would not appear to
apply to the situation you have described if your station is not receiving,
directly or indirectly, remuneration in exchange for airing the
advertisements. The advertisements in question are merely included in tapes
of old radio programs. Any remuneration involved was previously paid to the
stations which originally broadcast the programs. Accordingly, if your
station is not receiving any remuneration for airing the tapes you seek to
broadcast, the advertisements included in the programs may be broadcast.

One caveat, however, should be noted. The advertisement of digarettes, little cigars, and most other tobacco products on radio or television is prohibited by 15 U.S.C. §1335 and §4402. The U.S. Department of Justice enforces this prohibition.
