Re: Application of AT&T, Inc. and DIRECTV for Consent to Assign Licenses or Transfer Control of Licensees, MB Docket No. 14-90

Dear Mr. Quinn:

On June 11, 2014, AT&T Inc. ("AT&T") and DIRECTV (collectively, the "Applicants") jointly submitted applications to the Commission seeking consent to transfer control of various Commission licenses and other authorizations (collectively, the "Application") pursuant to Section 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended ("Act").¹ In order for the Commission to review the applications and make the necessary public interest findings under section 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act"), we require additional information, documents and clarifications of certain matters discussed in the applications and other information submitted to the Commission. If necessary, we will follow up with additional requests for information and documents.

Accordingly, pursuant to section 308(b) of the Act,² we request that AT&T provide written responses and supporting documentation for each request set forth in the enclosed Information and Data Request and, where appropriate, amend the applications to reflect such responses. We would appreciate receiving your responses no later than **Tuesday**, **September 23, 2014**. Information, data and narrative responses called for by the requests should identify the request to which they are responsive. Documents called for by the requests should have each page marked with a corporate identification and consecutive document control numbers as specified in the attached instructions and, where feasible, be grouped by the request to which they are responsive.

Your responses should be filed with Marlene H. Dortch, Secretary, FCC, under reference number MB Docket No. 14-90. For any responses that contain confidential or proprietary information, please follow the filing instructions set forth in the Joint Protective Order.³ For all
