

CONSENT MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Verizon requests an extension of time until Friday, July 10, to file its objection to NTCH's supplemental discovery request. NTCH consents to this request. By rule, any objection to NTCH's supplemental discovery request would be due within five calendar days – by Monday, July 6.¹ The additional time is needed because the NTCH discovery request is extensive and will require considerable time and effort to consider and prepare any objections. Also, extra time is needed because three of the calendar days allotted for Verizon's response fall on a holiday weekend when persons responsible for evaluating NTCH's request preparing the response will be unavailable.

For these reasons, the Bureau should grant Verizon's consent motion for extension of time.
