Dear Mr. Wishard:

On January 8, 2016, the Commission received a complaint regarding the operation of your amateur station. The complaint alleges that you routinely transmit obscene or indecent words or language in violation of Section 97.113(a) (4) of the Commission's rules and that you have knowingly caused interference to ongoing communications between other amateurs in violation of Section 97.101(d) of the Commission's rules.

Your operation as described above is contrary to the basis and purpose of the amateur radio service as set out in Section 97.1 and is a violation of Sections 97.113(a)(4) and 97.101(d) of the Commission's rules. Section 97.113(a)(4) states that "[n]o amateur shall transmit: obscene or indecent words." Further, Section 97.101(d) states that "[n]o amateur operator shall willfully or maliciously interfere with or cause interference to any radio communication or signal." Please be advised that the Commission expects you to abide by its rules.

This letter serves as notice that, if operation of this type reoccurs after receipt of this letter, you could be subject to severe penalties, including license revocation, monetary forfeiture (fines),² or a modification proceeding to restrict the frequencies upon which you may operate.
