Dear Chairman Pai:

I write in support of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's (PaPUC) request that the Connect America Fund Phase II (CAF II) funding declined by Pennsylvania companies stay within the state and finance Pennsylvania broadband infrastructure.

During the most recent disbursement of Universal Service Fund monies, nearly \$140 million in existing CAF II funding was declined by a major service provider in Pennsylvania. This CAF II funding was originally intended to support broadband Internet deployment in rural, high-cost areas across Pennsylvania, but the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) may now reallocate this financial support to other states. While rural portions of Pennsylvania still lack advanced Internet accessibility, the FCC should not continue to tax Pennsylvania ratepayers and then send those monies to other regions of the country for broadband improvements.

It is my understanding that on January 26, 2017, the FCC agreed to a similar request made by the state of New York. As you know, New York has approximately 430,000 residents without access to advanced telecommunications products whereas Pennsylvania has more than 800,000. These figures further illustrate the need to retain federal funds within the Commonwealth.

I respectfully ask that the FCC convey the same consideration to Pennsylvania as it did for New York and honor the PaPUC's petition for reconsideration. As the FCC considers this request, it is important to recognize that the declined CAF II disbursements were originally allocated for infrastructure improvements in Pennsylvania and should continue to support Pennsylvania ratepayers, who would otherwise lose out to ratepayers in other states.
