**NOTICE OF UNLICENSED OPERATION**

Case Number: EB-FIELDNER-17-00025290

On September 26, 2017, Agents from the New York Office (New York Office) of the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's or Commission's) Enforcement Bureau (Bureau) responded to complaints of an unlicensed FM station operating on the frequency 95.5 MHz in Hazleton, Pennsylvania. The Agents confirmed by direction finding techniques that radio signals on frequency 95.5 MHz were emanating from a residential property on Jackson Avenue, Hazleton, Pennsylvania. The Commission's records show that no license was issued for operation of a radio station on 95.5 MHz at this location in Hazleton, Pennsylvania. The New York Office investigated and determined you are the owner or operator of the unlicensed FM station on 95.5 MHz.

Radio stations operating on a range of frequencies,<sup>1</sup> including 95.5 MHz, must be licensed by the FCC pursuant to Section 301 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (Act).<sup>2</sup> The only exception to this licensing requirement is for certain transmitters using or operating at a power level or mode of operation that complies with the standards established in Part 15 of the Commission's rules.<sup>3</sup> Agents measured the field strength of the signal on the frequency 95.5 MHz for the station and found that it exceeded the maximum permitted level of 250  $\mu$ V/m at 3 meters for non-licensed devices. Thus, the station was operating in violation of Section 301 of the Act.<sup>4</sup>

You are hereby warned that operation of radio transmitting equipment without a valid radio station authorization constitutes a violation of the Federal laws cited above and will subject the operator to severe penalties, including, but not limited to, *in rem* seizure of the offending radio equipment without further notice, substantial fines, and criminal sanctions, including imprisonment.<sup>5</sup>

**UNLICENSED OPERATION OF THESE RADIO STATIONS MUST BE DISCONTINUED IMMEDIATELY AND MUST NOT RESUME.**

You have ten (10) days from the date of this notice to respond with any evidence that you have authority to operate granted by the FCC. Your response should be sent to the address in the letterhead and reference the listed case number. Under the Privacy Act of 1974,<sup>6</sup> we are informing you that the Commission's staff will use all relevant material information before it to determine what, if any, enforcement action is required to ensure your compliance with FCC Rules. This will include any information that you disclose in your reply.
