**NOTICE OF UNLICENSED OPERATION**

Case Number: EB-FIELDNER-18-00026245

On February 13 and 14, 2018, Agents from the New York Office of the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's or Commission's) Enforcement Bureau (Bureau) investigated a complaint of an unlicensed FM station operating on the frequency 87.9 MHz in the Irvington, New Jersey area. The Agents confirmed by direction finding techniques that radio signals on frequency 87.9 MHz were emanating from property owned by 141 Coit Street, LLC on 141 Coit Street, Irvington, New Jersey. Public records list you as the registered agent for the owner of this property. The Commission's records show that no license was issued for operation of a broadcast station on 87.9 MHz at this location in Irvington, New Jersey.

Radio stations operating on a range of frequencies,<sup>1</sup> including 87.9 MHz, must be licensed by the FCC pursuant to Section 301 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (Act).<sup>2</sup> The only exception to this licensing requirement is for certain transmitters using or operating at a power level or mode of operation that complies with the standards established in Part 15 of the Commission's rules.<sup>3</sup> On February 13 and 14, 2018, the field strength of the signal on frequency 87.9 MHz exceeded the maximum permitted level of 100 microvolts per meter ( $\mu\text{V}/\text{m}$ ) at 3 meters for non-licensed devices operating in the band 30-88 MHz.<sup>4</sup> Thus, this station is operating in violation of Section 301 of the Act.<sup>5</sup>

You are hereby warned that operation of radio transmitting equipment without a valid radio station authorization constitutes a violation of the Federal laws cited above and may subject the operator to severe penalties, including, but not limited to, substantial monetary fines, *in rem* arrest action against the offending radio equipment, and criminal sanctions, including imprisonment.<sup>6</sup>

**UNLICENSED OPERATION OF THIS RADIO STATION MUST BE DISCONTINUED IMMEDIATELY.**

You have ten (10) days from the date of this notice to respond with any evidence that you have authority to operate granted by the FCC. Your response should be sent to the address in the letterhead and reference the listed case number. Under the Privacy Act of 1974,<sup>7</sup> we are informing you that the Commission's staff will use all relevant material information before it to determine what, if any, enforcement action is required to ensure your compliance with FCC Rules. This will include any information that you disclose in your reply.
