Commissioner O'Rielly:

Since the inception of 9-1-1 in the State of Illinois the Program operated under the Illinois Commerce Commission. When Illinois' Emergency Telephone System Act was updated in 2015 it among other things moved the 9-1-1 Program to the Illinois State Police effective January 1, 2016.

911 Funds were diverted in the past. 911 Funds were not diverted in 2016 or 2017.

I have attached our Description of Diversion or Transfer of 911/E911 Fees for Other Uses responses to the 2015, 2016 and 2017 survey for your reference.

In comparing our diversion history to our survey responses, I found that for the annual period ending December 2015, I indicated that funds were diverted in April of 2015 and June of 2016 when in fact both diversions occurred in 2015.

I have also attached a history of the diversions that occurred in 2014 and 2015.

Please let me know when our diversion status has been updated.
