Re: Applications of T-Mobile US, Inc., and Sprint Corporation for Consent To Transfer Control of Licenses and Authorizations (WT Docket No. 18-197); General Information and Document Request for Charter

Dear Ms. Bohigian:

T-Mobile US, Inc., and Sprint Corporation have filed applications pursuant to Sections 214 and 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended,¹ seeking Commission consent to the transfer of control of licenses and authorizations from Sprint to T-Mobile. On July 18, 2018, the Commission accepted the applications for filing and established a pleading cycle for the proposed transaction.² For the Commission to complete its review of the applications under Sections 214 and 310(d) of the Act,³ we require information and documents from Charter. If necessary, we will follow up with additional requests for information and/or data.

Accordingly, pursuant to Section 308(b) of the Act,⁴ we request that Charter provide written responses and supporting documentation, as appropriate, for each request set forth in the attached General Information and Document Request. Each response should clearly indicate the specific question or request to which it responds, and each page should be marked with a corporate identification and consecutive document control numbers as specified in the attached instructions. We would appreciate receiving Charter's response to the General Information and Document Request no later than October 17, 2018.



In addition, the *Comment Public Notice* and the *Protective Order*⁵ require the submission of multiple copies of all *ex parte* and other filings submitted in this proceeding. The Wireless Telecommunications Bureau also should receive, at a minimum, two copies of all paper filings.
