
Dear Congressman Kinzinger:

Thank you for your letter on the 3.7-4.2 GHz band, commonly called the “C-band.” I agree with you that our ability to maximize the public value of this band is closely linked to ensuring that we can protect incumbent earth stations, cable operators, and commercial and public broadcasters who currently rely on the band.

That is exactly why Commission staff last year worked with such users to collect needed information (such as their locations). That is why the Commission unanimously adopted at our July 2018 meeting an information collection targeted to better understanding how existing satellite operators use the band. And that is why the Commission sought public input on how to protect incumbent users through any transition—whether through an auction or a market transaction—with the FCC exercising appropriate oversight. With these steps, the Commission hopes to be able to “avoid disruptions in the services American consumers currently enjoy,” as you request.

Thank you once again for expressing your views in your letter, which will be entered into the record of this proceeding and will be fully considered as part of the Commission’s review. Please let me know if I can be of any further assistance.


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
