Dear Congresswoman Brooks:

Thank you for your letter urging the Commission to modernize its rules governing the marketing and importation of radio frequency devices. There is no question that we must be flexible and agile in ensuring that American consumers have notice and access to the most technologically advanced and secure equipment without delay—not just to address the increased demand underscored by the pandemic, but to support the nationwide accessibility essential to our competitive status and economic well-being. In that spirit, the Commission has regularly reviewed its equipment authorization regulations and eliminated or modernized those that are unnecessary or outdated.

In December, the Commission adopted a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking that proposes updates to its marketing and importation rules to permit, prior to equipment authorization, conditional sales of radiofrequency devices to consumers under certain circumstances and importation of a limited number of radiofrequency devices for certain pre-sale activities. The comment period is still open until February 11, 2021, with reply comments due on February 26. I encourage all stakeholders to submit their views in the record, in order to help inform the Commission's consideration.
