On January 29, 2021, the Chair of Committee for the Assessment of Foreign Participation in the United States Telecommunications Services Sector (Committee) notified the Commission that the Committee is conducting an initial review to assess whether grant of a domestic section 214 application and a petition for declaratory ruling under section 310(b)(4) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, will pose a risk to the national security or law enforcement interests of the United States, pursuant to Executive Order 13913 (85 Fed. Reg. 19643 (April 8, 2020)).
