**TITLE:** Location-Based Routing for Wireless 911 Calls (PS Docket No. 18-64)

**SUMMARY:** The Commission will consider a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking regarding a proposal to require wireless carriers and covered text providers to implement location-based routing on their networks in order to reduce misrouting of wireless 911 calls and texts and improve emergency response times.

**TITLE:** Internet Protocol Captioned Telephone Service Compensation (CG Docket No. 22-408); Telecommunications Relay Services and Speech-to-Speech Services for Individuals with Hearing and Speech Disabilities (CG Docket No. 03-123); Misuse of Internet Protocol (IP) Captioned Telephone Service (CG Docket No. 13-24)

**SUMMARY:** The Commission will consider a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking and Order on Reconsideration to propose Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS) Fund compensation for Internet Protocol Captioned Telephone Service (IP CTS), propose a technical amendment to the compensation formula for Internet Protocol Relay Service (IP Relay), and resolve petitions for reconsideration of a prior order setting IP CTS compensation.
