## **FCC RECOGNIZES WINNERS OF THE 2025 CHAIRMAN'S AWARDS FOR ADVANCEMENT IN ACCESSIBILITY**

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) today announces the ceremony honoring winners of the 2025 Chairman's Awards for Advancement in Accessibility. The event will be held at 2:30 PM EDT on Thursday, July 24, 2025, in the Commission Meeting Room at FCC Headquarters, 45 L St NE, Washington, DC. It is open to the public. You do not have to register to attend the event.

The ceremony will be webcast with open captioning at [fcc.gov/live](http://fcc.gov/live). The meeting site is fully accessible to people using wheelchairs or other mobility aids. Sign language interpreters, open captioning, and assistive listening devices will be provided on site. Other reasonable accommodations for people with disabilities are available upon request. Include a description of the accommodation you will need and tell us how to contact you if we need more information. Make your request as early as possible. Last minute requests will be accepted but may be impossible to fill. The Chairman's AAA was first introduced in 2010 at the FCC's celebration of the 20th anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act. Since the first award ceremony, the Chairman's AAA has been a key part of the FCC efforts to recognize technical advances that have made communications tools more accessible to people with disabilities. The awards have been given 11 times to recognize outstanding private- and public-sector innovations designed to advance accessibility for people with disabilities.
