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DIRECT BROADCAST SATELLITE (DBS) SERVICE AUCTION NULLIFIED: Commission Sets Forth Refund Procedures for Auction No. 52 Winning Bidders and Adopts a Freeze on All New DBS Service Applications

The Commission hereby nullifies the results of Auction No. 52, an auction of Direct Broadcast Satellite ("DBS") licenses conducted on July 14, 2004. Specifically, the Commission sets forth below instructions for payors of record to receive refunds of the winning bids that were paid to the Commission. In addition, as explained below we adopt a freeze on all new DBS applications.

In Auction No. 52, two winning bidders, Rainbow DBS Company LLC ("Rainbow DBS") and EchoStar Satellite L.L.C. ("EchoStar"), won three DBS licenses. Rainbow DBS won a license to operate on 32 channels at the 175° W.L. orbital location and a license to operate on 32 channels at the 166° W.L. orbital location. EchoStar won a license to operate on 29 channels at the 157° W.L. orbital location. Both winning bidders timely submitted long-form applications and paid their winning bids in full.² On June 21, 2005, the United States Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit held in *Northpoint Technology, Ltd. v. FCC* that Auction No. 52 was unauthorized.³ In light of this holding, the Commission adopts a freeze on all applications for new DBS authorizations to use the 12.2-12.7 GHz band and associated feeder links in the 17.3- 17.8 GHz band pending Commission consideration of the appropriate processing rules for applications to provide DBS in the United States, and sets forth refund procedures.

Rainbow DBS and EchoStar filed their respective applications (FCC Main Form 312 and Schedule B) on September 17, 2004 (IBFS File Nos. SAT-LOA-20040917-00182, SAT-LOA-20040917-00183, and SAT-LOA-20040917-00184). Dec. 20, 2004). No comments were filed on any of the applications. EchoStar filed an amendment to its application on May 13, 2005. DBS Freeze. The freeze on DBS applications applies to any application for authority to provide DBS service to the United States using the 12.2-12.7 GHz band and associated feeder links in the 17.3-17.8 GHz band, including unassigned channels at orbit locations assigned to the United States under the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) Region 2⁴ Broadcasting Satellite Service⁵ and feeder-link Plans, ⁶ as well as applications for DBS service from space stations located at orbital locations not assigned to the United States in the ITU Region 2 BSS and feeder-link Plans. This freeze is limited to applications for licenses for new space stations or for new requests for market access by foreign-licensed space stations. The freeze does not apply to applications for replacement satellites, modifications to existing satellite licenses, or requests for special temporary authority, unless such applications seek authority to operate on frequencies and/or orbital locations not previously authorized for operation by that licensee. The freeze also does not apply to amendments to pending DBS license applications unless the amendment would add frequencies or orbital locations that were not in the original license application.

Refund Procedures. Refunds of the winning bids submitted to the Commission will be paid to the payors of record. On September 22, 2005, EchoStar requested a refund of its winning bid of \$5,800,000 plus interest from June 18, 2004, the date it submitted these funds as part of its upfront payment, to the date of the refund "calculated at the applicable rate for overpayments under Section 6621 of the Internal Revenue Code." The Commission, however, does not have the authority to pay interest to license applicants on monies it refunds to them. Therefore, the winning bids currently on deposit with the Commission in connection with Auction No. 52 will be refunded to the payors of record without interest.

To receive a refund to which it is due, each payor of record must comply with the following procedures: 10

It was not until 1985, at the World Administrative Radio Conference (WARC Orb-85), that the Region 2 Plans were adopted internationally worldwide and became a part of the ITU's Radio Regulations. The ITU Region 2 BSS Plan is comprised of the Plan for BSS in the band 12.2-12.7 GHz in ITU Region 2, as contained in Appendix 30 of the ITU Radio Regulations, and the associated Plan for the feeder-links in the frequency band 17.3-17.8 GHz for the broadcasting-satellite service in Region 2, as contained in Appendix 30A of the ITU Radio Regulations.

- Submit a letter (along with the ACH form) signed by the payor of record, requesting a refund and identifying the applicant and file number of the associated pending application. The Commission will calculate the amount of the applicable refund.

- Agency Information Section Federal agency prints or types the name and address of the Federal program agency originating the vendor/miscellaneous payment, agency identifier, agency location code, contact person name and telephone number of the agency. Also, the appropriate box for ACH format is checked.
- 2. Payee/Company Information Section Payee prints or types the name of the payee/company and address that will receive ACH vendor/miscellaneous payments, social security or taxpayer ID number, and contact person name and telephone number of the payee/company. Payee also verifies depositor account number, account title, and type of account entered by your financial institution in the Financial Institution Information Section.
