By the Commission:

- 1. We hereby dismiss the Application for Review ("Application") filed by Texas Networking, Inc. ("Texas.Net") of the Media Bureau *Order* denying its August 9, 2001 complaint and petition for declaratory ruling regarding AOL Time Warner's compliance with the Internet access requirements imposed in the Commission's *Memorandum Opinion and Order* conditionally approving the merger of America Online, Inc. and Time Warner, Inc.³ Texas.Net expressed its desire to withdraw its Application by letter dated March 14, 2007.⁴
- 2. In light of Texas.Net's letter seeking to withdraw its Application, the full Commission need not and does not reach the issue of whether the *Bureau Order* was correct on the merits.
